HKAF's ongoing efforts on maintaining Hong Kong a low-prevalence region

The Centre for Health Protection (CHP) of the Department of Health (DH) has recently released the latest figures on the HIV/AIDS situation in Hong Kong from January to March as of 2020. A total of 129 additional cases of HIV infection were reported from January to March (1st quarter of 2020). This figure represents a slight decrease of 1 case compared to the previous quarter (4th quarter of 2019: 130 additional cases). In total, the cumulative number of HIV infections has reached 10,409 cases.

According to the CHP reports, of the 129 new cases, 105 were males while 24 were females. On the transmission front, 57 cases acquired the infection via homosexual or bisexual contact, 34 via heterosexual contact and 38 cases have yet to be determined due to incomplete information upon notification. In other words, sexual contact remains the major route of transmission regardless of their sexuality.

Although the total number of additional cases has shown a decrease for two consecutive quarters, the Foundation still shows concern about the continuing rising trend of new cases. Regardless of severe influence of COVID-19 pandemic since early 2020, the Foundation has taken a step forward by launching virtual services to the community.
